CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

THE CHILDREN'S COURSE
19825 RIVER RD
GLADSTONE OR 97027

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL, tributary to WILLAMETTE RIVER for IRRIGATION of 16.7 ACRES.

This right was perfected under permit G-1862. The date of priority is MAY 16, 1961. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.21 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device at the point of appropriation. If the Director notifies the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device specified by the Director within the period allowed in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 13, 2012, at Special Order Volume 87, Page 273, approving Transfer Application 6942, supersedes Certificate 32511, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
