CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of A SPRING, tributary to WEST DIARY CREEK for COMMERCIAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit 33778. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 25, 1968. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, OR 2.24 GALLONS PER MINUTE AND SHALL NOT EXCEED 3231 GALLONS PER DAY AT ANYTIME OF YEAR THAT BENEFICIAL USE IS MADE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
