CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

KENNY HARRISON
2014 MILL CREEK RD
WALLA WALLA WA 99362

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL, within the WALLA WALLA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 22.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit U-365. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 28, 1950. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.28 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The well is located as follows:

5 N	35 E	WM	3	SE NW	886 FEET NORTH AND 1032 FEET WEST FROM C1/4 CORNER, SECTION 3

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Land on which water is to be used is part of that described as follows:

Beg. at a point on the N. & S. center line of the NW¼ of Sec. 3, T.5N., R. 35E., 1650 ft. S. of the NW corner of the NE¼ of the said NW¼, running thence S. along the N. & S. center line of said NW¼, 817 ft. thence N 89°03' E. 1320 ft., more or less, to the N. & S. center line of said Sec. 3, thence N. along the N. & S. center line of said Sec. 3 to the SE corner of that tract of land conveyed to John E. Daugherty by deed recorded in Book 125, Page 267 of the Deed Records of Umatilla County, Oregon, thence W. along the S. line of said tract to the SE corner of that tract of land conveyed to Ben Cochran by deed recorded in Book 181, Page 425 of the said deed records, thence W. along the S. line the last mentioned tract to the point of beginning, all being E. of the Willamette Meridian.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation described as follows:

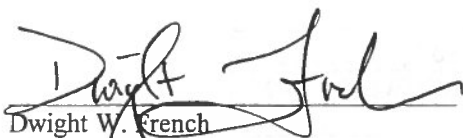

When required by the Department the water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water appropriated. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered FEBUARY 28, 2006, at Special Order Volume 68, Page 126, approving Transfer Application 9847, and supercedes Certificate 22865, State record of Water Right Certificates.
