## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JOHN BRUNS SISTERS, OR 97759

confirms the right to use the waters of LAKE CREEK, for IRRIGATION, of 54.66 ACRES, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

The right was confirmed by decree of Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County and the said decree entered at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 9, Page 362. The date of priority is 1888. The amount of water to which this right is entitled for the purposes aforesaid is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre measured at the point of diversion from the stream, which may be diverted at a rate of not to exceed 1/60<sup>th</sup> of one cubic foot per second during the irrigation season from May 1 to September 15; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 76025, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered DEC 5 2014 approving Transfer Application T-11457.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights including rights for maintaining instream flows.
