CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CAROL WILLIAMS

confirms the right to use the waters of LAKE CREEK, for IRRIGATION of 52.5 ACRES, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

The right was confirmed by decree of Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County and the said decree entered at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 9, at Page 362. The date of priority is 1888. The amount of water to which this right is entitled for the purposes aforesaid is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre measured at the point of diversion from the stream, which may be diverted at a rate of not to exceed 1/60th of one cubic foot per second during the irrigation season from May 1 to September 15; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.


Prior to October 1, 2014, the water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Prior to use of the water, the water user shall install and maintain fish screens or fish by-pass devices, as appropriate, at the new points of diversion. The type and plans of the screens or by-pass devices must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction, and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate is issued to confirm a HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered Dec 5th 2014, approving Transfer Application T-11457, and supersedes Certificate 76025, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
