CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of SIX WELLS in PATAWA CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION of 53.38 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-8964. The date of priority is MARCH 13, 1980.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.48 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.11 CFS FROM WELL 2, 0.11 CFS FROM WELL 3, 0.04 CFS FROM WELL 4, 0.06 FROM WELL 6, 0.11 CFS FROM WELL 7, AND 0.05 CFS FROM WELL 8, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

This certificate is issued to confirm a CHANGE IN POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered APRIL 25, 2000, at Special Order Volume 54, Page 297, approving Transfer Application 8373, and together with Certificate 76524, supercedes Certificate 53554, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
