## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of Olgivie Well #1 in the WILLOW CREEK BASIN for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 5.4 acres.

This right was perfected under Permit G-9926. The date of priority is September 20, 1982. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.07 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (cfs) or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cfs, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. Furthermore, the use shall be limited to appropriation of water only to the extent that it does not impair or substantially interfere with existing surface water rights of others. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
