CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

COVENTRY FARMS LLC PO BOX 1579 SANTA CLARITA CA 91386-1579

confirms the right to use the waters of THREE RESERVOIRS for CRANBERRY OPERATIONS on 24.6 ACRES; RESERVOIR 1, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-14876, RESERVOIR 2, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-14877, AND RESERVOIR 3, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-14878, TRIBUTARIES OF SUMMERS CREEK.

This right was perfected under Permit S-54781. The date of priority is OCTOBER 31, 2007. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 44.0 ACRE FEET (AF) measured at the points of diversion, being a maximum volume of :12.0 AF FROM RESERVOIR 1, 2.0 AF FROM RESERVOIR 2, AND 30.0 AF FROM RESERVOIR 3.

PERIOD OF USE: YEAR-ROUND

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water diverted for cranberry operations, together with amounts secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall not exceed a maximum of 3.0 acre feet per acre, and is further limited as follows: For temperature control, 0.15 cubic foot per second per acre; for flood harvesting or pest control, 0.05 cubic foot per second per acre; for irrigation of cranberries, one fortieth of one cubic foot per second and 3.0 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. For the irrigation of any other crop, the amount of water diverted is limed to one eightieth of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre feet per acre during the irrigation season of each year. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter at each point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter(s); where the meter is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used, and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.
- D. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring and reporting procedures for review and approval.

Notwithstanding that Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has made a determination that fish screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary at this time, the water user may be required in the future to install, maintain, and operate fish screening and/or by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the diversion, and to provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to the agreement.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
