## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

RAY WILLIAMS T O WILLIAMS AND ASSOCIATES 49654 UMAPINE RD MILTON FREEWATER OR 97862

confirms the right to use the waters of PINE CREEK, tributary of WALLA WALLA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 14.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 37588. The date of priority is JANUARY 15, 1973. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of diversion.

If water for these rights is available at the original point of diversion on Pine Creek, existing water rights on Pine Creek above the confluence of Dry Creek will not be regulated for these rights.

If there is insufficient water in Pine Creek to satisfy existing water rights diverting water between the original point of diversion and the additional point of diversion may be regulated to satisfy the existing rights.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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When required by the Department, the water user or irrigation district shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

When required by the Department, the water user or irrigation district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original points of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 24, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, Page 576, approving Transfer Application 7834, supercedes Certificate 45089, State record of Water Right Certificates.
