## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ANNA & NEAL J. DOW FLP 28000 SE PAULINA HWY PRINEVILLE OR 97754

confirms the right to use the waters of CROOKED RIVER, tributary to DESCHUTES RIVER for IRRIGATION of 44.9 ACRES.

This right was perfected under permit S-42025. The date of priority is JANUARY 2, 1976. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.13 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion which are located as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or other suitable measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen, as appropriate, at the point of diversion (i.e. POD #6) consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife operational and maintenance standards.

Notwithstanding that Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has made a determination that by-pass devices are not necessary at this time, the water user may be required in the future to install, maintain, and operate by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the diversion, and to provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in an additional POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 9, 2011, at Special Order Volume 85, Page 46, approving Transfer Application T-11150, and together with Certificate 87106, supersedes Certificate 86200, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
