confirms the right to use the waters of PINE CREEK, a tributary of POWDER RIVER for IRRIGATION of 44.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the State Water Board of the State of Oregon in Volume 6, at Page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1890.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 OF ONE CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE, and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

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screen is required. Once installed the water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the new point of diversion according to ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.
