CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of JOHN DAY RIVER, tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 60.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3751. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 4, 1918. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.75 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

13 S	29 E	WM	24	SE SW	ADDITIONAL POD - 300 FEET NORTH AND 3200 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 24

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of diversion described as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required, the water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

When required, the water user shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device. The water user shall report the total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.


Water shall be acquired from the same surface source as the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 16, 2001, at Special Order Volume 55, Page 1242, approving Transfer Application 7631, supercedes Certificate 47511, State record of Water Right Certificates.
