CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of JOHN DAY RIVER, tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 52.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1871.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.3 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS).

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE IRRIGATED FROM APRIL 1 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30; FURTHER LIMITED TO 1.0 ACRE-FOOT PER ACRE PER CALENDAR MONTH TO JULY 1 AND 0.75 ACRE-FOOT PER ACRE THEREAFTER; TOTAL 5.0 ACRE-FEET FOR SEASON, MEASURED AT POINT OF DIVERSION.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required, the water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

When required, when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface source as the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 16, 2001, at Special Order Volume 55, Page 1242, approving Transfer Application 7631, supercedes Certificate 57548, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
