CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

YOUNG LIFE

confirms the right to use the waters of CURRANT CREEK, a tributary of the JOHN DAY RIVER, for STORAGE FOR MULTIPLE PURPOSES.

This right was perfected under Permit R-8452. The date of priority is DECEMBER 7, 1981. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1020.0 ACRE-FEET, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

8 S	18 E	WM	35	SE SE	620 FEET NORTH AND 1020 FEET WEST FROM THE SE CORNER, SECTION 35

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The reservoir is located as follows:

The dam shall be operated, and maintained according to the approved plans and specifications on file with the Water Resources Department, including but not limited to the following:

An Emergency Action Plan shall be prepared for Currant Creek Dam and reservoir by the owner/operator of said structure upon human habitation of any downstream residence or other existing structure below the dam and/or between the embankment and the confluence of Currant Creek with the John Day River. The Plan shall be approved by the Water Resources Director and shall be updated annually.

The right to store and use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands described above.


**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The storage of water for multiple purposes shall occur only when there are valid secondary permits or water rights for use of the stored water for the various uses. The storage of water for multiple purposes shall continue only so long as these are valid secondary permits or water rights for use of the stored water for various uses. If there are no valid water secondary permits or water rights, the reservoir shall be drained and the gates left open or the dam breached.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered DECEMBER 21, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, Page 1103, approving Transfer Application T-7886, and supersedes Permit R-8452, for which Proof to Satisfaction was established.
