CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LAURIE HAMILTON 1613 FISH HATCHERY RD GRANTS PASS OR 97527

confirms the right to use the waters of APPLEGATE RESERVOIR. CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMITS R-7829 AND R-7810, for IRRIGATION of 2.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-53753. The date of priority is MAY 19, 2000. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 7.0 ACRE FEET or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The period of allowed use is April 1 through October.

The point of re-diversion from Applegate River is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of 4.5 acre feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

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The totalizing flow meter shall be maintained as identified in OAR 690-507-645.

During June 16 through September 15, water may be diverted only when the return flow temperature is no higher than 1 degree Fahrenheit of the temperature as measured at the intake point. The water user is encouraged to coordinate with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife for information on maintaining temperature monitoring equipment.

The water user shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The applicant is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, Portland, Oregon, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract number 009E101290, or a satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the water user, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Failure to comply with any of the provision of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties or cancellation of the right.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may only be made at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior water rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
