CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

C. L. REAM  
PRINEVILLE, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of DRAKE CREEK AND REAM'S RESERVOIR, TO BE CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT NO. R-398, a tributary of CROOKED RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATION.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3356. The date of priority is APRIL 9, 1917. The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.11 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant (if for irrigation, or any other purpose), is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for any purpose is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 10844, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered December 31, 2014, approving Transfer Application T-11750 and correcting the location of the point of diversion.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
