#### CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CITY OF ATHENA PO BOX 686 ATHENA OR 97813

confirms the right to use the waters of ROGERS WELL No. 3 in the WILDHORSE CREEK Basin for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11624. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 24, 1992. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 600 GALLONS PER MINUTE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

A description of the place of use is as follows:

## CITY OF ATHENA SERVICE AREA

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

If a well listed on this water right displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the City shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the well. Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the City's or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The City shall in no instance allow excessive decline to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this water right.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.
