CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

S. LOUGHBRIDGE  
GRANTS PASS, OR 97526

confirms the right to use the waters of the ROGUE RIVER, a tributary to the PACIFIC OCEAN for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 16.2 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-1290. The date of priority is JULY 8, 1912. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.20 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate is issued pursuant to remanded Transfer Application T-8366 involving *Fort Vannoy Irrigation District v. Water Resources Commission*. This certificate describes the diminution entered JAN 21 2015 and recorded in Special Order Volume 93, Pages 1165-1170 and describes the portion of original Certificate 1953 NOT modified by any superseding order. This certificate supersedes Certificate 85231.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.
