CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO
W. A. AND CORA W. SHARP

GRANTS PASS, OR 97526

confirms the right to use the waters of SHARPS BAYOU, tributary to SAND CREEK for IRRIGATION of 29.55 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-4669. The date of priority is JUNE 28, 1920. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.38 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 3564, diminished by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JAN 27 2015 in Special Order Volume 93, Pages 1165-1170. This certificate supersedes Certificate 85232.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
