CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ROGUE RIVER VALLEY IRRIGATION DISTRICT 3139 MERRIMAN RD MEDFORD, OR 97501

confirms the right to use the waters of FOUR MILE LAKE RESERVOIR, within the KLAMATH RIVER BASIN; and waters draining or flowing into the CASCADE CANAL and FISH LAKE RESERVOIR, within the ROGUE RIVER BASIN; as constructed under Permit R-50; for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit 407. The date of priority is MARCH 31, 1910. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.25 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS). The season of use under the right shall be limited to the irrigation season, and the annual volume shall not exceed 356.94 acre-feet per year.

Water is conveyed from Four Mile Lake via the Cascade Canal, and held, and stored in Fish Lake. Water is rediverted and released into the North Fork Little Butte Creek, and is rediverted into the Main Canal shared by Rogue River Valley and Medford Irrigation Districts. At Bradshaw Drop the water is split between the Hopkins Canal and the Medford Canal. The City of Eagle Point has the option to receive delivery of this water via being passed by the diversion on the North Fork Little Butte Creek and transported through Little Butte Creek to the Rogue River to the point of diversion on the Rogue River.

Total diversions through the Main Canal from North Fork and South Fork of Little Butte Creek shall not exceed 140 CFS at any one time.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.

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Certificate Number 89864

The water user shall maintain a suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The Lake Creek gaging station on Little Butte Creek (Station number 14346700) is an acceptable measuring point for use in fulfillment of this requirement.

Use of water for municipal use under this right is illegal without an approved fish screening and/or by-pass device in operation.

After October 1, 2007, no diversion of water under this right for municipal use will be allowed until adequate fish screening and/or by-pass devices have been installed and approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. Prior to diversion of water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent of the water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

The water user shall lease the right instream until such time as an approved fish screen and/or by-pass device is installed.

This certificate is issued to correct a scriveners error in the name of the water right holder and supersedes certificate 85409, previously issued to confirm AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION, AND CHANGES IN PLACE OF USE AND CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 5, 2007, at Special Order Volume 72, Page 255 approving Transfer Application T-10160, and together with Certificate 83263 supersedes Certificate 81635, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

Water may be applied to lands which are not specifically described above, provided the holder of this right complies with ORS 540.510(3).

The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 81635 and any related decree.
