## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

J FRANK SCHMIDT AND SON PO BOX 189 BORING OR 97009

confirms the right to use the waters of WALLA WALLA RIVER, tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 93.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-1303. The date of priority is JULY 24, 1912. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.16 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under an other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen and fish by-pass device.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an additional POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 4, 2002, at Special Order Volume 56, Page 1063, approving Transfer Application 9121, and correcting order entered April 9, 2003, at Special Order Volume 57, Page 420, supersedes Certificate 26675, State record of Water Right Certificates.
