THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

SALMON VALLEY WATER COMPANY
 PO BOX 205
 WELCHES OR 97067

confirms the right to use the waters of 2 WELLS in the SALMON RIVER Basin for QUASI-MUNICIPAL USES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-13176. The date of priority is MARCH 13, 1996. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.37 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.201 CFS FROM WELL 1 AND 0.167 CFS FROM WELL 2, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

Water may be appropriated from August 1 through August 31 of each year.

The well is located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream, namely the Sandy River, decreases to the point that it no longer meets state and federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available after the right is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

Use of water from the wells, as allowed herein, shall be regulated if the well displays:

- (A) An average water level decline of three or more feet per year for five consecutive years; or
- (B) A total water level decline of 15 or more feet; or
- (C) Hydraulic interference leading to a decline of 15 or more feet in any neighboring well providing water for senior exempt uses or wells covered by priority rights.

The reference levels against which any future measurements will be compared is 35 feet below land surface for Well 1, and 50 feet below land surface for Well 2.

The water user shall install and maintain a meter or other measuring device suitable to the Director, and shall keep a complete record of water uses.

The water user shall be responsible for complying with each of the following requirements for measuring water levels in the wells.

- (A) A water level measurement shall be made each year at the time of spring high water during the period March 15 through April 15.
- (B) All water level measurements shall be made by a qualified individual. Qualified individuals include certified water rights examiners, licensed water well drillers, registered geologists, registered professional engineers, registered land surveyors, licensed well constructor, pump installer licensed by the constructor, pump installer licensed by the Construction Contractors Board, or the water user/appropriator.
- (C) Any qualified individual measuring a well shall use standard methods of procedure and equipment designed for the purpose of well measurement. The equipment used shall be well suited to the conditions of construction at the well. A list of standard methods of procedure and suitable equipment shall be available from the Department.
- (D) The water user/appropriator shall submit a record of the measurement to the Department on a form available from the Department. The record of measurement shall include both measurements and calculations, shall include a certification as to their accuracy signed by the individual making the measurements and shall be received not later than 30 days from the date of measurement. The Department shall determine when any of the declines cited previously are evidenced by the well measurement required in this section.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a useable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the wells at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.
