confirms the right to use the waters of COTTONWOOD CREEK, tributary to NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 18.7 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1879.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1/40 cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80 cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion.

When in the judgment of the Department it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

The diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water which the water user is entitled;

The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and that the weir or measuring device shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 25, 1987, at Special Order Volume 41, Page 607-A, approving Transfer Application 5966, supercedes Certificate 44177, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
