CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STUBBLEFIELD DITCH COMPANY
ENTERPRISE, OREGON 97828

confirms the right to use the waters of HURRICANE CREEK, a tributary of WALLOWA RIVER for the IRRIGATION of 157.6 ACRES, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3279. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 10, 1917. The amount of water to which this right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.10 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 46104, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY 11 2015 , approving Transfer Application T-11827.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

NOTE: (The right hereby confirmed for 30 acres in the SE1/4 NE1/4, Section 11, T. 2 S., R. 44 E., W.M., is supplemental to rights heretofore acquired from Wallowa River and Little Hurricane Creek.)

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
