confirms the right to use the waters of RESERVOIR 3 AND RESERVOIR 4, CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-73610, PERMIT R-11511, TRIBUTARIES OF CRYSTAL CREEK, for CRANBERRY OPERATIONS ON 2.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-54270. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 6, 2005. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 7.5 ACRE FEET (AF) EACH YEAR; BEING 3.75 AF FROM RESERVOIR 3 AND 3.75 AF FROM RESEVOIR 4.

The period of allowed use is March 1 through November 30.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water diverted for cranberry operations, together with amounts secured under any other rights existing for the same lands, shall not exceed a maximum of 3.0 acre feet per acre and is limited as follows; for temperature control, 0.15 cubic foot per second per acre; for flood harvesting or pest control, 0.05 cubic foot per second per acre; for irrigation of cranberries, ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 3.0 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. For the irrigation of any other crop, the amount of water diverted is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre feet per acre during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter. The totalizing flow meter must be maintained in good working order consistent with those standards identified in OAR 690-507-645(1) through (3). The water user shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter; provided however, where the meter is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to the agreement.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
