confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-6030. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: LITTLE APPLGATE RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF APPLGATE RIVER

PURPOSE or USE: IRRIGATION OF 74.23 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.93 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: SEPTEMBER 13, 1923

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening, as appropriate, at the additional point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 43760 and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered June 29, 2009, at Special Order Volume 78, Page 258, approving Transfer Application 8934, and together with Certificate 82009, supercedes Certificate 43760, State record of Water Right Certificates.
