CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

FOUNTAIN SEACAT  
BAKER OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of WASHINGTON GULCH, tributary POWDER RIVER for IRRIGATION of 1.72 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at Page 291. The date of priority is 1867.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Prior to November 3, 2017 the water user shall install and maintain a fish screen at the new point of diversion. The type and plans of the screen must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction, and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 3, 2015, approving Transfer Application T-11979, and supersedes Certificate 4446, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.
