CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

C2 CATTLE CO. 18495 HWY 140 EAGLE POINT, OR 97524

confirms the right to store the waters of WASSON CANYON, SPRING CREEK, AND LONG CANYON, TRIBUTARIES OF NORTH FORK LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, WITHIN THE ROGUE BASIN IN WADE RESERVOIR, ORIGINALLY CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-1716 FOR THE STORAGE OF 645.0 ACRE-FEET, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION S-80661, PERMIT S-53382, FOR IRRIGATION OF 25.3 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 17.45 ACRES.

This right to store these waters was perfected under Permit R-12461. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 2, 1995. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 547.44 ACRE FEET or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

Water may be appropriated for storage during the period of FEBRUARY 1 THROUGH APRIL 30 OF EACH YEAR.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.

B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water may not be appropriated for storage from Wasson Canyon when the natural rate of flow is less than 0.5 cubic foot per second at the point of diversion.

At the point of diversion from Wasson Canyon the water user shall maintain and operate fish screening and by-pass device as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The project must be operated and maintained according to the approved plans and specifications dated August 15, 1957, a copy of which is on file with the Department in Dam Safety File #W45.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of a fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plans.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to store and use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described.
