CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WILLIAM A. SUNDAY
WINONA LAKE, INDIANA 46590

confirms the right to use the waters of NEAL CREEK, a tributary of HOOD RIVER for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 33.2 ACRES, DOMESTIC and STOCK.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Hood River County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 469. The date of priority is March 1901.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.39 cubic foot per second (cfs); and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 3846, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of two Final Orders of the Water Resources Director entered December 13, 2007, approving Transfer Application T-10416 and August 18, 2009, approving Transfer Application T-10748. This certificate corrects the amount of acres described in the place of use from partial cancellations contained in the aforementioned Final Orders, supersedes Certificates 83679 and 85742.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
