## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

## THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

E. L. RIGHTMIER R.F.D. NO. 3 GRANTS PASS, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of APPLEGATE RIVER, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 8.5 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 16, at Page 523. The date of priority is 1902.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.17 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 32863, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 6, 2015, approving Transfer Application T-11757.

This certificate corrects a scrivener's errors in Certificate 89959. The number of acres was written as 12.5 instead of 8.5, which required an adjustment in the rate from 0.25 cfs to 0.17 cfs. This Certificate supersedes Certificate 89959.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
