#### CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

### THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

## STATE OF OREGON WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of Deschutes River, tributary to the Columbia River, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values; recreation; and pollution abatement.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, at Page 282 and in Volume 16, at Pages 1 and 390. The date of priority is October 31, 1900. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed:

Reach No. 2: From the location of the North Canal Dam diversion authorized previously under Certificate 83571, located approximately at:

To Lake Billy Chinook at River Mile (RM) 120

Reach No. 3: From Lake Billy Chinook (River Mile 120) to the Madras Gage at approximately RM 100.1

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

# Reach No. 4: From the Madras Gage (RM 100.1) to the mouth of the Deschutes River (RM 0)

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion within the specified stream reach.

Water rights upstream of the original point of diversion shall not be subject to regulation for flows in excess of the quantities to which this instream water right is entitled at the original point of diversion.

These mitigation credits may be used to satisfy a mitigation obligation within the Middle Deschutes Zone of Impact and/or

General Zone of Impact

Each mitigation credit equals 1.0 AF of mitigation water, as determined by the Department.

The number of mitigation credits awarded is a portion of the total volume transferred instream, being 49.05 AF from POD No. 1 and 138.17 AF from POD No. 11. The remaining balance of water dedicated to instream use, and not used to satisfy the mitigation obligation of a ground water permit (and subsequent certificate(s)), will benefit instream flows.

The mitigation credits or mitigation water established by this instream water right may be used to satisfy a mitigation obligation of a ground water permit application(s) and/or a ground water permit(s)/ certificate(s) within the Deschutes Ground Water Study Area pursuant to the Deschutes Ground Water Mitigation Rules.

Mitigation credits valid until used to satisfy a mitigation obligation of a ground water permit applicant and/or ground water permit/certificate holder.

The instream right established by this transfer shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right,

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 83571, and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in use and place of use approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 98, Page 932, approving Transfer T-11110, supersedes a portion of Certificate 83571, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
