CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

H. DARRELL HOLLIDAY  
27542 INDIAN CREEK RD  
JOHN DAY, OR 97845

confirms the right to use the waters of INDIAN CREEK, tributary to JOHN DAY RIVER for IRRIGATION of 48.3 ACRES AND DOMESTIC.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1879.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1/40 cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80 cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:


When in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices, the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled. The type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 85454, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered 3-28-2016, approving Transfer Application T-11840.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
