NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device at each point of appropriation in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation (Well 1), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation (Well 2), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of appropriation.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation

The well(s) shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works shall include an airline and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The water user shall maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in additional point of appropriation approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 28, 2013, at Special Order Volume 89, Page 998, approving Transfer Application 11482, and together with Certificate 88299, supersedes Certificate 82370, State record of Water Right Certificates.
