CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

R. M. FOREST
BUNCOM, OR 97530

confirms the right to use the waters of LITTLE APPELEGATE RIVER, a tributary of APPELEGATE RIVER for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 38.3 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the State Engineer, in Volume 4, at page 1; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1900 for 0.15 cubic foot per second for the irrigation of 5.75 acres; 1897 for 0.12 cubic foot per second for the irrigation of 4.50 acres; and 1872 for 0.70 cubic foot per second for the irrigation of 28.05 acres; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.97 cubic feet per second.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 16396, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUL 20 2016, approving Transfer Application T-12225.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
