confirms the right to use the waters of the MIDDLE FORK OF THE WILLAMETTE RIVER and water stored in Catching Reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-605, for the purposes of FIRE PROTECTION FOR SAW MILL, DOMESTIC, MANUFACTURING USE, AND MAINTENANCE OF A LOG POND AT RESERVOIR.

This right was perfected under Permit S-8519. The date of priority is JUNE 6, 1928. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 8.98 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
