CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

G I RANCH CORP.; WILLIAM SMITH 15 SW COLORADO AVE SUITE A BEND OR 97702

confirms the right to use the waters of TWO WELLS in LONG CANYON BASIN for IRRIGATION of 269.0 ACRES, being 228.0 ACRES from Well F-3 and 41.0 acres from Well F-6.

This right was perfected under Permit G-17237. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 25, 2000. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 3.36 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS), further limited to no more than and 2.85 CFS from Well F-3 and 0.51 CFS from Well F-6, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The period of use is March 1 through October 31.

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meters or other suitable measuring devices as approved by the Director at each point of appropriation in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, Well F-6, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation, Well F-3.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available after the right is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interference.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a useable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the wells at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 90461, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered ________, approving Transfer Application T-12313.
