confirms the right to use the waters of the Walla Walla River, a tributary of the Columbia River, for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 0.62 acres.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, Page 9. The dates of priority are 1875 and 1880.

The use is limited to one miner's inch per acre, or 0.015 cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.
