 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WILLIAM AND MARLENE SAAGER
 125 SAAGER STREET
 MILTON-FREEWATER, OR 97862

confirms the right to use the waters of the Walla Walla River, a tributary of the Columbia River, for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 2.52 acres.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, Page 9. The date of priority is 1885.

The use is limited to one miner's inch per acre, or 0.063 cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described, and the right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the above described decree.


