confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-17969. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: JOHN DAY RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 45.6 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.14 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: OCTOBER 1, 1946

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.0 acre-foot per acre for each acre irrigated during any month prior July 1 and thereafter 3/4 of one acre-foot per acre for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a total diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season from April 1 to September 30 of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion together with that diverted at the original point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain and operate the existing measurement device and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.


The water user shall maintain the existing headgate and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 24, 2011, at Special Order Volume 83, Page 393, approving Transfer Application 11081, supercedes Certificate 24617, State record of Water Right Certificates.
