confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-29675. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: WEST FORK WILLIAMS CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF WILLIAMS CREEK

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 5.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.063 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 19, 1964

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
39 S	5 W	WM	4	NE SW	720 FEET SOUTH AND 1240 FEET WEST FROM C1/4 CORNER, SECTION 4

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where any meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.


The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 8, 2010, at Special Order Volume 80, Page 576, approving Transfer Application 10559, and together with Certificate 86067, supercedes Certificate 35746, State record of Water Right Certificates.
