 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ANN INGHAM
 26248 METOLIUS MEADOWS DR
 CAMP SHERMAN OR 97730

confirms the right to use the waters of LAKE CREEK, TRIBUTARY TO THE METOLIUS RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE AND IRRIGATION OF 1.97 ACRES AND POND MAINTENANCE on 0.14 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 9, at Page 362. The date of priority is 1888.

The use is limited to 3.0 acre-feet per acre, measured at the point of diversion from the stream, which may be diverted at a rate of not to exceed 1/60th cubic foot per second per acre during the irrigation season from May 1 through September 15, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use of water for pond maintenance use under the irrigation portion of the right shall not exceed a total quantity diverted of 0.42 acre-foot per year and shall not exceed a rate of diversion of ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second during the irrigation season from May 1 through September 15, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use of water for pond maintenance under the domestic portion of the right shall not exceed a total quantity diverted of 1.46 acre-feet per year, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

Water Use Measurement conditions:

- a. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring device in good working order.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.


The water user shall maintain the existing headgate and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish scree and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered March 26, 2012, at Special Order Volume 87, Page 239, approving Transfer Application 11076, and together with Certificate 87472, supercedes Certificate 81669, State record of Water Right Certificates.
