confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-7574. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the wells. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: THREE WELLS IN THE PUDDING RIVER BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 10.6 ACRES AND 152.7 ACRES SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION

MAXIMUM RATE: 2.03 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS); BEING FURTHER LIMITED 0.13 CFS FROM WELL 6 FOR PRIMARY IRRIGATION AND 1.90 CFS FROM WELL 7 FOR SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 27, 1977

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original points of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.


Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original points of appropriation.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water appropriated. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 25, 2004, at Special Order Volume 62, Page 8, approving Transfer Application 9414, supercedes Certificate 56753, State record of Water Right Certificates.
