confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-10490. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the wells. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: TWO WELLS IN THE WILLAMETTE BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 88.9 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.1 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 1, 1985

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation (wells), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation at all times.

Water use measurement conditions:

- a. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device and keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.


Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered February 24, 2014, at Special Order Volume 91, Page 875, approving Transfer Application 11517, supercedes Certificate 83230, State record of Water Right Certificates.
