CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-38310. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: JOHN DAY RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE or USE: IRRIGATION OF 5.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.1 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 21, 1973

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
13 S	30 E	WM	26	SW NW	1170 FEET NORTH AND 460 FEET EAST FROM W1/4 CORNER, SECTION 26

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

When required by the Department, the water user or irrigation district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered July 30, 2004, at Special Order Volume 60, Page 864, approving Transfer Application 9549, supercedes Certificate 56308, State record of Water Right Certificates.
