 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LEONARD ESTATE CO.
 GRANTS PASS, OR 97526

confirms the right to use the waters of the ROGUE RIVER, a tributary to the PACIFIC OCEAN for IRRIGATION of 39.37 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 0.63 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3798. The date of priority is MAY 11, 1918. The amount of water to which this right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually used beneficially for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.50 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.49 CFS for Primary Irrigation and 0.01 CFS for Supplemental Irrigation.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

This certificate describes a diminishment of the water right approved by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 7, 2016, approving Transfer Application T-12391 and supersedes Certificate 5561, State Record of water right Certificate.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
