confirms the right to use the waters of the ROGUE RIVER, a tributary to the PACIFIC OCEAN for IRRIGATION of 16.81 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 3.19 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-7141. The date of priority is JANUARY 22, 1926. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.21 CFS for Primary Irrigation and 0.04 CFS for Supplemental Irrigation.
