confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-38463. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: WILLAMETTE RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 162.6 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 2.04 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: JULY 25, 1973

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of diversion, together with that diverted at the old points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original points of diversion.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain headgates, in-line flow meters, weirs, or other suitable devices for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgates and measuring devices must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain fish screens or fish by-pass devices, as appropriate, at the new points of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described and is subject to the existing minimum flow polices established by the Water Policy Review Board.

This certificate is issued to confirm a CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION, approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 20, 2005, at Special Order Volume 67, Page 332, approving Transfer Application 7126, and together with Certificate 81568, supersedes Certificate 46091, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
