The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The water user shall operate and maintain an approved fish screen at the point of diversion.

The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION; ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 15, 2013, at Special Order Volume 88, Page 1189, approving Transfer Application 11410, supercedes Certificate 56562, State record of Water Right Certificates.
