confirms the right to use the waters of the CROOKED RIVER, a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 70.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3003. The date of priority is JULY 8, 1916. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.88 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.
