CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

HOMER NORTON POST OR 97752

confirms the right to use the waters of the CROOKED RIVER, a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 34.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit E-38 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon and duly confirmed by order of the State Water Board of Oregon, made and entered of record in the Record of Proceedings of said Board, at Salem, in Volume 1 at page 152, on the 19th day of November, 1913.

The date of priority is MARCH 3, 1910. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.431 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 81325, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBEC 31, 2016, approving Transfer Application T-12165.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
